

Members Matters: Gregg Follmer: As told to Carl Ramsey Reprint

Gregg Follmer was born Oct 11, 1949 (one day before Carl Ramsey, newsletter editor). He graduated from Bishop Dubourg High School in 1968 and joined the Marine Corps, in December, 1968; but he didn't leave for Boot Camp, until March, 1969. In his ITR (Infantry Training Regiment) picture, he appears in Row 3 from top, person 7 from right. An 0311 rifleman, he served in Vietnam from August, 1969, to August, 1970, as part Fox Company, Second Battalion, Fifth Marine Regiment, First Marine Division.

On one occasion, as reported in an attached newspaper article, his company encountered enemy soldiers floating in a river on their backs breathing through bamboo tubes. They opened up and eliminated them. Meantime Gregg captured an enemy officer, along with his handgun and holster, which he received authorization, along with a carbine to be shipped home with export licenses as war

souvenirs, via airfreight. (See pictures.) He told me one of his captured weapons originally had a dead round in the chamber.

When he came home, he got an early out. He worked at a Sinclair Full-Service Gas Station for six years, Rentco for eleven years where he leased tractor trailers. Then he spent 27 years driving trucks.

In addition to the Marine Corps League, he's a member of the Vietnam Veterans group, and he's a master railroad model builder as indicated by his pictures.

As also indicated by his pictures, he recently suffered a shoulder injury, which has temporarily limited his veteran's activity.

He and his wife live in a sub-division near a very hard to reach location where the Meramec River flows into Mississippi. He told me the confluence of those rivers, that I have always wanted to visit, is unreachable except by boat because the location is occupied by a power station.

Enemy Gets Taste Of Fox Co.'s Fury

AN HOA — Twenty NVA and
VC soldiers were killed and 29
captured in a two-hour firefight,
after Leathernecks of Company
F, 2d Bn., 5th Marines, trapped
them on a peninsula in the Vua
Gia River.

Sweeping along the southern bank of the river five miles northwest of An Hoa Combat Base, the 1st Plt. spotted an enemy soldier hiding in dense grass on a small peninsula.

Staff Sergeant Edward B. Bryer, (Jacksonville, N.C.), 1st Pit. commander, described the

action that followed.

"The point man opened up on the enemy, but he ran farther onto the peninsula. I sent a squad after him, and they came back under heavy automatic weapons fire and a grenade attack. We couldn't see any of the action because of the high river grass, but I sent in another squad to reinforce them. Captain Furr sent another platoon around the far end of the peninsula to block any escape and, as soon as they were in position, we started sweeping through," he explained.

Leathernecks swept through the thick grass, capturing some enemy soldiers who had hidden in dense brush, and pulling others from the water where they had hidden. Ten of them tried to escape by rushing the blocking force that had swept around to the end of the peninsula. They were pushed back. Three others tried to swim the river and, when they didn't halt after the Marines had called for them to surrender, they were killed by small arms fire. Finally after 20

of them had been killed, what was left of the enemy platoon surrendered.

"After the battle was over," explained Fryer, "we started checking the prisoners out. We found one NVA engineer, who said he was there to set booby traps; and my boys just glared at him, thinking about the buddies they had lost, probably to the same booby traps this man had set. We also found a couple of officers among the prisoners with their notebooks and documents still intact."

The Leathernecks also captured one 9mm pistol, one AK-47 assault rifle, more than 20 packs loaded with food, medical supplies, clothing and documents and more than 40 chi-com gre-

nades.

"What really made the men angry was that we only captured a few of their rifles because they were throwing them into the river before being taken prisoner," stated Capt. Furr. "The rainswollen river was too deep and swift to risk sending men in after them, so we called in for Reconnaissance scuba divers to come out the next day."

"I can't understand why their commander had them in such a ridiculous position with no avenues of escape, but it was a sweet victory for the Marines. All together we accounted for 49 NVA and VC and only three of our men received minor wounds

from grenade shrapnel.

"We had been humping for three days through rain-soaked rice paddies and the men were looking for action, but we never expected to find this much," he concluded.
